Crochet Cupcake Purse



Materials Needed

- Size H or 5mm crochet hook
- Worsted Weight Yarn (size 4)
 - o I used these colors but feel free to use any worsted weight yarn:
 - Redheart SuperSaver in the color Café Latte
 - o Redheart SuperSaver in the color White
 - Walmart Mainstays Yarn in the color Multi Pink
 - Joanns Big Twist Value Yarn in the color Deep Red
- Scissors
- Tapestry Needle
- Measuring Tape
- Stitch Markers

Optional Materials

- Pony beads
- Decorative Beads
- Letter beads

Stitch Abbreviations

- Ch-chain
- Sl St- Slip Stitch
- Sc- Single Crochet
- Dc-Double Crochet
- Dcblo- Double Crochet Back Loop only
- Dcflo- Double Crochet Front Loop only

Notes

- Chain 2 at the start of each row does not count as a stitch
- Written in US terms

- Bag is worked from the bottom up
- First yarn color will be the color of your cupcake wrapper
- Stitch counts are at the end of each round
- I recommend using a stitch marker to mark the start of each round

Pattern:

To Start: Ch 3, Sl St into the first chain

Round 1: Ch 2, work 12 Dc into circle, Sl St to the beginning of chain (12)

Round 2: Ch 2, work 2 Dc in each st, Sl St into beginning chain (24)

Round 3: Ch 2, work 1 Dc in the first st, *2 Dc in the next st, 1 Dc in next st repeat from * around your circle, Sl St into beginning ch (36)

Round 4: Ch 2, work 1 Dc in the first two st, *2 Dc in the next stitch, 1 Dc in the next two st, repeat from * around, Sl St into beginning ch (48)

Round 5: Ch 2, work 1 Dc in the first three st, *2 Dc in the next st, 1 Dc in the next three St, repeat from * around, Sl St into beginning ch (60)

Round 6: Ch 2, work 1 Dc in the first four st, *2 Dc in the next st, 1 Dc in the next 4 st, repeat from * around, Sl St into beginning ch (72)

Round 7: Ch 2, work 1 Dc into the first five st, *2 Dc in the next st, 1 Dc in next 5 st, repeat from * around, Sl St into beginning ch (84)

Next, you will be continuing to work in a circle but now you're working up the sides of your bag

Round 8: Ch 2, work 1 Dcblo in each st around, Sl St into beginning ch (84) Rounds 9-14: Ch 2, work 1 Dc in each st around, Sl St into beginning ch (84)

Change yarn to your cupcake color!

Round 15: with your new/cupcake color, attach new color and secure to your work, ch 2, Work 3 Dcflo In each st around, Sl St in the beginning ch, tie off yarn, and sew in end. (252)

Now before you attach your cupcake color for Round 16, if you want to add pony beads into your work, this is where you would do so. If you decide to add beads, you simply string 25 to 30 beads of your color choice onto your yarn. (I use regular sized pony beads.) Then as you work rounds 16 – 24 you drop and work the beads into your work.

Round 16: attach cupcake yarn color to Back Loop, Ch 2, work 1 Dcblo in each BACK LOOP around, Sl St in the beginning ch (84)

Rounds 17-23:(if you're adding beads, drop them into your work as you work up these rounds!) Ch 2, work 1 Dc in each st around,Sl St in the beginning ch (84)

Change to white for the whipped cream

Rounds 24-26: Ch 2, work 1 Dc in each st around, Sl St in the beginning ch (84) Finish off, and sew in your ends.

Cupcake Purse Handle:

Note: keep in mind that the handle will stretch with use

With same color yarn as your cupcake color or coordinating yarn color: Start at the first St of Round 26 and count to the 19th St, Sl St yarn to attach handle color,

Row 1 of handleCh 2, 1 Dc in same st, then 1 Dc in the next four St, Ch 2 and turn (5)

Rows 2-39: 5 Dc, Ch 2, turn work (5)

Repeat until desired length, for this pattern I made my handle around 20 inches which is 39 rows When you're finished, don't tie off!

Starting back on Round 26, count from the 23rd stitch on your bag (last st of where your handle was attached), to the 61st St, Sl St handle onto this st, Ch 1, Sc in the same st and the next four St to attach handle to the other side of your bag. (These sc will be attached over stitches 61-65) on the top of your bag.)

Drawstring Closure:

With yarn color of your choice: Use 3 strands of worsted weight acrylic yarn around 60 inches in length. Start from the front center of your bag, 2nd row from the top of your bag, weave the 3 strands of yarn held together in and out in between 2 stitches at a time all around your bag.

I like to add pony beads to my yarn strands for an extra touch. You can also use letter or decorative beads. I triple knot my strands below the beads or without the beads to secure the strands. Make sure your drawstring is even all around your bag, and trim to your liking.

Sew in ALL of your ends.
